Né en 1976, docteur en Histoire et en Théologie. Directeur de l'Institut international de l'héritage athonite, directeur du Centre d'étude de l'héritage des nouveaux martyrs et confesseurs du XXe siècle, chercheur associé à l'Institut d'histoire de l'Académie des sciences d'Ukraine, professeur associé du département des Sciences humaines de l'Académie de gestion du personnel de la culture et des arts du Ministère de la culture d'Ukraine, acteur de la Culture ukrainienne, spécialiste de l'histoire locale ukrainienne, membre du bureau de l'Union nationale des historiens de l'Ukraine, Vice-président de l'Union de Tchernihiv des participants à la lutte pour l'indépendance de l'Ukraine au XXe siècle (ONG). Born 1976, holds a PhD in History; Doctor of Theology (ThDr.); he is Director of the International Institute of the Athonite Legacy, Director of the Centre for Studies of the Legacy of New Martyrs and Confessors of the 20th Century, Research fellow of the Institute of History of Ukraine at the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, Associate professor of the Department of Humanities of National Academy of Managerial Staff of Culture and Arts at the Ministry of Culture of Ukraine, Honored Worker of Ukraine Culture, Honorary Local Historian of Ukraine, Member of the board of the National Union of Local Historians of Ukraine, Deputy Chairman of Chernihiv Union of participants of the struggle for Ukraine's independence in the twentieth century (NGO). Editor-in-Chief of the *Athonite Legacy* Almanac; Member of the Editorial Board of the All-Ukrainian Scientific Journal *Siverians'kii Litopys* [*Siberian Chronicle*]; Member of the editorial board of the all-Ukrainian scientific journal "Regional Studies"; Member of the editorial board of the popular science journal "Pamiatki Ukrainy: istoriia ta kul'tura" [Ukrainian Monuments: History and Culture]; Member of the editorial board of the popular science journal "Liberation Struggle"; Representative of Stanford University Hoover Institution in Ukraine.

Organizer of more than 20 international scholarly conferences on Ukrainian church history (including those supported by UNESCO, Keston Institute at Oxford (UK), Columbia University (USA), and the World Council of Churches (Geneva, Switzerland)). For a long time he was engaged in research work abroad (Greece, Italy), held personal lectures, exhibitions and presentations on Ukrainian heritage of Athos in more than ten countries of Europe (Oxford, Cambridge, London, Paris, Strasbourg, Geneva, Brussels, Rome, Venice, Milan, Naples, Athens, Warsaw, Prague, Iasi, etc.).

He is the author of 10 books and monographs, and of over 100 articles on the history of the Church and of Mount Athos, and the recipient of a number of international literary prizes.
